

SECTION 017 -- FORESTRY

***PROJECT RECORD SHEETS REQUIRED FOR YOUTH BUILDING ENTRIES.**

A General Project Record or Cloverbud Project Record and an Exhibit Tag **must** accompany each exhibit entered in the Youth Building. A copy of the General Project Record and Cloverbud Project Record is enclosed in the fair book. Additional copies of the Project Records can be found in past issues of the 4-H Leaders' Digest, our web site at www.cce.cornell.edu/delaware/ or by visiting or calling the 4-H office.

Fair book classes that required a 3" x 5" index card attached to an entry in the past is no longer required. The Project Record Sheet will take the index card's place.

Class No.

- 2326 Tree identification notebook as called for in the "Know Your Trees" project. (i.e. 10 leaves and twigs w/buds)
- 2327 Mounted display identifying at least 15 different kinds of wood found in New York woodlots, with their uses. May be made up of small section of the trees, showing bark, cross and tangential sections of the trunk and mounted on board.
- 2328 Backyard maple syrup. An example of maple syrup produced by the exhibitor. One pint of syrup in a glass container is acceptable.
- 2329 Maple cream - exhibited in a glass container is acceptable.
- 2330 Trees from seeds. Examples of seedlings grown from seed planted by the exhibitor. An exhibit should consist of at least six seedlings of one tree species.
- 2331 Poster display (22x28") showing the value of woods to man, wildlife, soil conservation, etc.
- 2332 Any other approved 4-H project made as a part of a related 4-H project that does not fit any other class.
