Exhibits must be in place on Monday at 5 PM and will not be released until 6 PM Saturday.

Approximate time of arrival to be noted on entry form.

MUST clean and add new shavings to pens daily **before 10:00 am**

Exhibitors are required to have sorting boards.

Proper show attire is required. No shorts, hats or improper T-shirts. No jeans with holes or sloppy fit.

Only 4-H Auction Animals can be released early.

Health requirement Information

1. Each exhibitor must conform to the animal health regulations of the Department of Agriculture and Markets as specified in entries and rules on fair website. See New York State Regulations for Fairs.

2. Health certificate and official ear tag required for each animal.

Class entry information

1. All purebred animals must have official ear tag matching information on health certificate as well as registration papers to show superintendent prior to show
2. Each exhibitor is limited to no more than two (2) entries per class.
3. Breeding classes shall be for purebred swine with registration papers available to the superintendent before show day. **Please bring to superintendent by Monday at 5pm**
4. All breeds shall be judged as one class, except if a minimum of two (2) swine of one breed are entered in a class they will be judged as a separate class providing there are at least two (2) additional entries of all other breeds in class.
5. Gilts entered in the purebred classes **may not** be entered in the market classes.

Section 002 -- Market Classes

General information:

- All market hogs must be weighed on the fairgrounds to be shown. Weigh in 1pm Monday, 10 am
- Friday for Auction animals only
- Market hogs exhibited may be purebred, commercial or crossbred barrows or gilts.
- Depending on the number of entries in each market class, classes will be broken into small groups at the discretion of the judge.
- Class winners will compete for Grand Champion Market and Reserve in the Championship Drive.
